Congress Strengthens Brady Background Check System

Congress passed a bill that will strengthen the Brady background check system. It will help ensure that fewer guns end up in the hands of dangerous people like felons and those who have been found to be threats to themselves or others because of mental illness.

After the Virginia Tech tragedy, our national leaders were asked, "What are you going to do about gun violence?"

The tide is turning. Congress passed the first major piece of legislation to reduce gun violence in over a decade.

The <u>"National Instant Check System (NICS) Improvement</u> <u>Amendment Act of 2007</u>" (H.R. 2640) was passed by unanimous consent in the U.S. Senate and House, and now goes to the President's desk for signature.

An Invitation To Competition

TO OLD AND NEW MEMBERS ALIKE: When you joined OFGC, you heard a brief description of the various competition groups within the Club. Like me, you no doubt thought to yourself that this was the elite, the top shooters in the organization, and there was no way you would fit in with these groups. Well, I was wrong.

I shot my first Practical Pistol match in August, 2001, with a standard Glock Model 23 (my existing carry gun), with mags sticking out of my pocket rather than in mag holders on my belt. I knew one person when I got to the match. The first thing I was told was that like everyone else at the match had done in the past, I was shooting competition for the first time. They took me by the hand, led me through the entire process, and I finished the most exciting day of my life. I can honestly say that today most of my best friends are people I have met through competition shooting.

I am sure you will find the same warm welcome at any of the organized shooting events. As a new member, your first shoot at any of the matches is free. Match fees are usually only \$10 to \$15, cheaper than a movie, and we don't push \$5 buttered popcorn. The second goal (after safety) of every participant, regardless of skill, is to have fun. Shooting, like any other sport, requires practice to improve. Attend the event of your choice, and I promise that you will leave each match a better shooter with your gun of choice, and will have a great time in the process.

Handgun Self-Defense Tip

If you keep a handgun for self-defense, what is your "ready position?" With an intruder in the home, or a bad guy approaching, arms fully extended, gun pointed at the ground about 3 feet in front of you? Walk through a doorway, and the bad guy on the other side uses his left hand to block the rise of your gun while his right hand makes use of his gun or knife to cause serious injury. Try a two-hand grip, elbows bent, with the gun against the upper chest, pointed straight out and level. If the Threat surprises you, you can extend straight forward on target, or even fire from that position. You just won the fight. Try it at a few feet next time you are on the range.

Old Fort Shootist Changes

Last year the Board of Directors decided to put all members that had an e-mail address on a bulk mailing list to send out notices about the club and inform members when the Old Fort Shootist is on the Web site ready to view and download. This saved the club about \$100 per month. What we found out is that many of our members are not reading the Shootist.
