Charleston Youth Has Sights on National Title By John Neihouse



Most 14 year olds spend their summer in pursuit of summer jobs to gain a little spending money, or while away the hours in front of the television set either watching programming or blasting whatever bad guy happens to be the subject of the current video game. Charleston's Kolby Rasmussen, however, has a different agenda. Kolby has his eye on a National Championship.

2007 is Rasmussen's first year to shoot the full National circuit. In 2006 he began to shoot a Smallbore Silhouette rifle as a cross-training element for the 4H programs he was shooting in. He quickly realized he had a talent for the game and shot a limited National tour last year, earning honors at the Southern Nationals in Winnsboro, Louisiana in June of 2006, and taking the Tennessee State Championship outright in August in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Then in September, at the Arkansas State Championship held in Benton, Arkansas, Kolby beat all comers to win the Hunter Rifle Resident Championship, becoming the youngest person to ever accomplish that feat.

This spring Rasmussen picked up where he left off, winning the Florida State Championship in AAA and then two weeks later winning the AAA Championship at the Conard Bernhard Cup in PeEll, Washington. The Conard Bernhard Cup, Silhouette shooting's equivalent of golf's Masters, pits the best shooters in the country against each other in a grueling two day-four match tournament that features the best offhand shooters in the country. Kolby went into the last match of the day down five targets and posted a personal best of 36/40 to claim the AAA championship by one target. In doing so, he served notice to the rest of the country that there was a new talent in town and he wasn't going to back down under pressure. In June, Rasmussen made the trip back to Winnsboro, Louisiana, where it all started for him, and swept the AAA Louisiana State Championship at the Southern Nationals and earned top sub-junior honors, walking off with over \$2,000.00 in prizes and awards.

Now the stage is set for Rasmussen to go head-to-head with the best of the best, not only from the United States but from Canada, Mexico, Australia, and Ireland in Raton, New Mexico at the NRA National Championships which will be held July 8-10. The Charleston middle-school student is one of the pre-event favorites to take the sub-junior National Championship.

All of this success in precision rifle shooting has not gone unnoticed. Upon his return from Washington State and his win there, Kolby was named Channel 5's Athlete of the Week, the only non-stick and ball athlete to be so honored. He has attracted the attention of several college coaches, especially University of Arkansas's Lion Rifle's Coach Roy Hill. "I'm very impressed with Kolby's work ethic and natural ability and coach ability. "When the time comes, we will certainly be interested in him," said Hill recently. And, most likely, so will a lot of other college shooting programs.
